

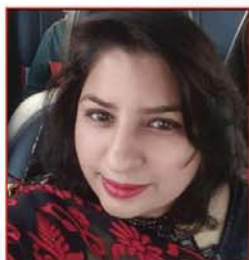

# RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TEACHERS IN THE PRESENT WORLD SCENARIO

As a teacher basically, I would like to share few of my thoughts to you about the basic responsibilities of any teacher more particularly a teacher who works in a CBSE system. A person who teaches any aspect/concept is called a teacher. Carpenter, goldsmith, tailor and cobbler and such and such professionalisms are also in one way teachers. Mother is the first teacher to anyone. Nature is the second teacher. Society is the third one.

Nowadays, number of graduates and post-graduates

from Arts, engineering graduates from science and engineering stream, are opting for teaching. Some of them are willingly chosen and some of them are gotten into, by chance and becoming teachers. Any teacher who wants to improve his professional strength, certain norms should have to be followed to come out successful.

I really love to take this opportunity, as an experienced teacher in this educational field with more than 30 years of experience, to share some of my ideas that may



helpful to many working as well as upcoming teachers as guidelines.

1. Report to school on time and strictly follow the school timings.
2. Greet with a smile to colleagues not waiting others to greet.
3. Put signature in attendance register no sooner had you entered on correct time.
4. Go to staff room and keep your bag and books at allotted Cup-board.
5. Go to allotted classroom a bit earlier accommodating yourself dot time.
6. Never resume a chair in class room particularly during instruction.
7. Be ready to class with thorough preparation of the lesson at home, with prescribed text books and standard reference books and magazines.
8. Teach the lesson effectively with proper motivation and introduction, concept clarity and with a briefing at the end.
9. Attend the arrangement class and make the students to avail the time productively.
10. Do Class work and home work correction in leisure period.
11. Use library services effectively.
12. Update your subject knowledge through refereeing newspapers and magazines time to time.
13. Submit daily lesson plan to the Head.
14. Use proper teaching aids.
15. Give reasonable home work to the students.
16. Encourage the students to complete class work and home work timely.
17. Correct examination sheets within stipulated time.
18. Maintain proper decency in the staff room and discuss academics only.
19. Be patient with colleagues and others.
20. Control indiscipline among students within your preview.
21. Be aware that, corporal punishment is against to the education norms.
22. Make sure and strive for 100% results.
23. Extension of support to your colleagues is appreciable.
24. As medium of instruction is English likely in CBSC schools, prefer to communicate in English on campus, with colleagues and students.
25. Create Competitive and Co-operative spirit among students.
26. Encourage the queries of the students.
28. As a part of punishment don't send the students outside the class room.
29. Submit assessment papers as per schedule.
30. Casual leaves should be granted before availing.
31. Wear decent dress.
32. Maintain proper distance with opposite sex colleagues and students.
33. Share your good thoughts and ideas in school assembly.
34. Play with students at play ground in leisure periods.
35. Give a chance to students for teaching his/her peer groups.
36. Conduct class tests in proper intervals.
37. Attend to school assembly compulsorily.
38. Guide the students to follow assembly activities.
39. Maintain proper discipline for effective learning.
40. Encourage the students to write running notes.
41. Guide the students to keep separate class work and home work books.
41. Ready to follow any assignment given by school from time to time.
42. Don't allow students to outside frequently for toilet / water.
43. Don't do correction work during teaching period.
44. Complete the syllabus of teaching as per plan.
45. Be a role model.

Of course you may be able to add few more with your experience to these above guidelines to become a successful teacher.

# “Reimagine Education and Accelerate Change in Teaching and Learning”

It's approx. two years, when our students had to rely on online education. The COVID-19 pandemic and consecutive lockdown have affected the education system severely. Since, people were stuck in their houses for months, there was no way for students/children to continue their studies. It was all like holidays for them being happy and enjoying leisure time at home without work as studies. But, seriously, was it a free time, leisure time to enjoy uselessly? No, it was not, as everything was turning into a disastrous mess. Keeping aside all other issues, it would be better to take up the problems of students. They were deprived of their knowledge and to overcome this problem, government needed to find an alternative to it, in which they succeeded. This alternative was online mode of education.

As, we know, recently a lot of changes has been brought in our education system with the launch of New Education Policy-2020(NEP). Along with this, online mode of education was also adopted with new set of rules. But incorporating online education in the general education system wasn't an easy task as it had many challenges.

About 30% of the people living in rural areas are computer illiterate and for online education basic computer knowledge is very important affording laptop and computer is really a difficult task for the low-class community like maids, household staff etc.

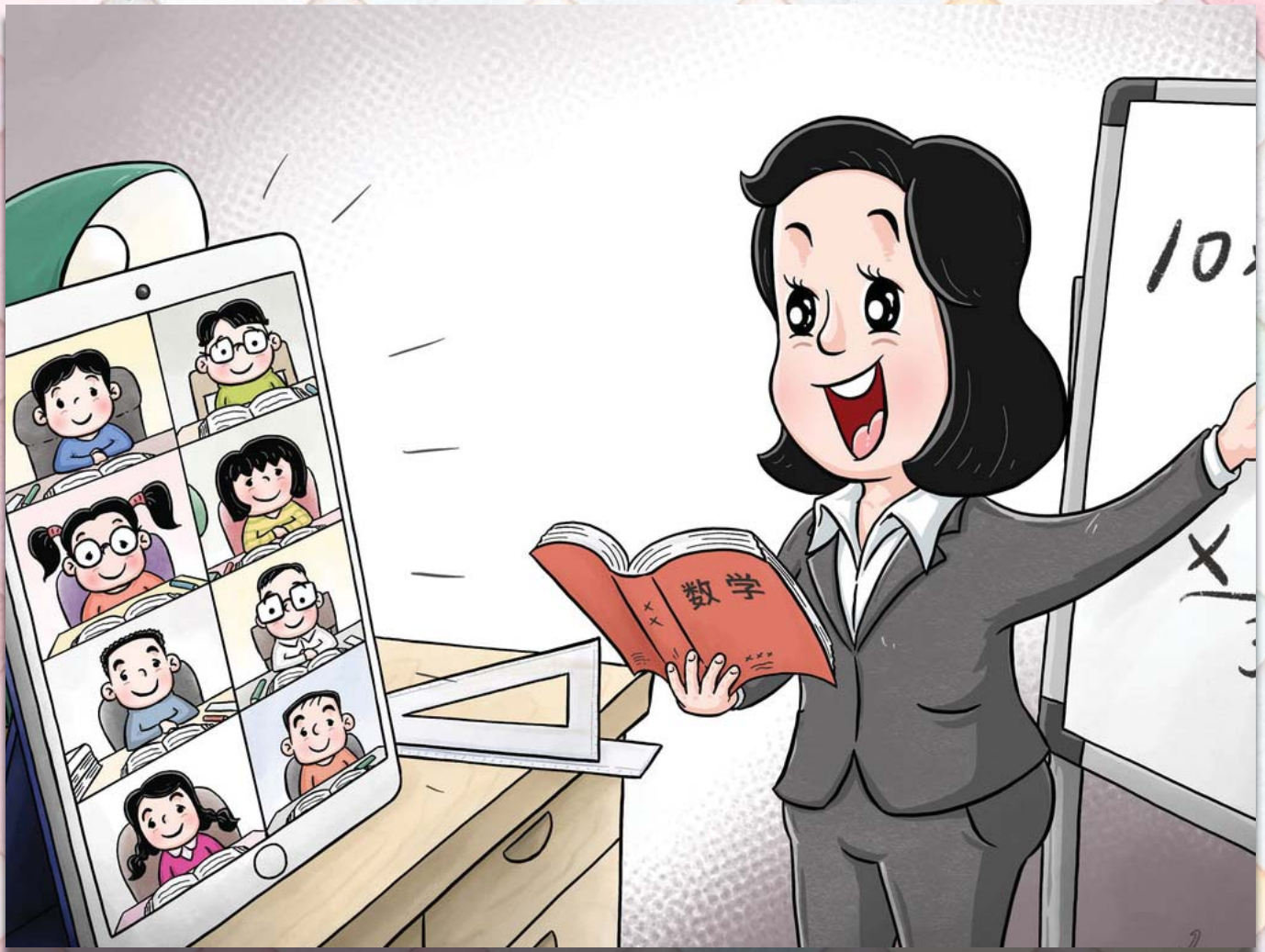
It is even a big challenge for teaching community. All the teachers are not computer savvy, i.e., are not comfortable with this system. It has been observed, even the good teachers, expert in their own subject were unable to give their best on online mode of education. Being physically present in classroom in front of students, teaching was better and more comfortable for them. Facing camera and imparting lessons was quite a tedious job. Many teachers were found to see facing problem in handling smart phones, laptop and computer as they have to prepare prior, videos, pdf and files of the lessons which made them uncomfortable. Apart from this, imparting theoretical knowledge on

online made was easy and possible but when things came to practical knowledge, students become deprived of it. Though video for practical classes or knowledge were made but it's not the solution. Experience comes practically nor by theories, practical knowledge among children is utmost important which cannot be overlooked.

Beside these, there are many other problems which has been faced at various levels. Conduction of online classes, online examinations, live sessions, streaming them for children belonging to rural part of the country was and even is a hat trick job. Notonly in rural but in urban region too it's a tough job. Especially conduction of examination and live session, throughout the country on same day, same time has to be managed. And this job can suffer due to poor network connectivity. It's not that all people living in rural areas cannot afford expensive smart phones, laptop, computer but system seems to be failed due to poor connectivity which cannot be avoided. It is a big issue for online education to make it successful on country wide level. There are many developed platforms like Google, Firefox, Chrome and many other web browsers on which online mode of education can be done but problem remains the same, all good sources become useless if good, adequate network connectivity is not available.

Last but not the least, excessive screen duration is also a serious issue for children. Parents are worried for it. As the students have to spend excess time on digital screen for all sort of teaching and learning process. Homework, assignments, projects etc. for every tit and bit children are enforced to spend long duration on digital screen, which puts a strain on their eyes and brain and this is not good for their mental health.

After having a large number of drawbacks, still some positive impacts lie on this new system i.e., online education. Due to global pandemic, online education has fallen into the most basic levels of schools and college. Students and Teachers both, who cannot easily access offline mode of education, being a distance



commutes, have found online mode of education convenient, easy and more flexible as it is reaching to them at their own place and not vice versa.

Taking another working group of people who are interested in acquiring knowledge but cannot as they be engaged in their livelihood; even they can continue their studies through online classes. For such group of people online education has come in form of boon. Online education is a good option for them to be educated without disturbing their daily livelihood. Schedule of the classes are flexible in which working group of people can adjust themselves well.

Rather than this the expenses of schools, colleges, fees, expenses of travelling, lodging, boarding have also reduced. It has become only possible because of online education. It is more affordable to them who wish to continue earning along with the education. There are no limitations of courses, faculties on online mode. Aspirants can get all sort of courses, faculties from

throughout the world according to their desire. Study materials available on YouTube, help the students getting their queries cleared immediately saving time. This new mode of learning holds out the possibility of on-demand access to content on any type of online digital platform.

Though, our present education system is a blend between classical and conventional way of teaching and learning process, so contradictions will always remain. Online mode is easily accessible in today's time but still there is no alternative of Teachers and Class teaching.
